
We communicated with people in many unique ways, giving a part of ourselves, receiving a part of others.

were what made GLHS.















### National Forensics League, Health Careers Club
















### Colorguard, Band














### Choir, Mixed Chorus








#### Ski Club

Without even knowing him well, anyone could realize that his wife Esther, his children and football were the main things in his life.


There wasn't a man who went out of his way more to help an individual personally or educationally.








#### Golf
















#### Girls' Tennis








#### **Cross Country**






# Girls' Swimming







# Boys' Basketball

The Wildcat Basketball Team ended their season, posting a successful 11-5 record, along with a third place spot in the Section I-AAA standings.

Although many teams would feel content with third place, this was not the case for Latrobe.

Coach Ray Zsolcsak's team had high hopes of finishing the season in second place, behind an undefeated Norwin team, but they first had to deal with Hempfield, the main obstacle on the path to the playoffs.

In a very questionable game at Hempfield, Latrobe's playoff hopes died, as they lost to the Spartan's 50-53.

The Wildcats found themselves with two other disappointing losses this year. One to Jeannette, in the second round, 60-56 (Scott Smith and Jeff Yunetz each scoring 15 points while Max Regula contributed 14) and to Greensburg Salem 55-54 (Yunetz 19 points, and Smith 17.)

At Greensburg, the Wildcats trailed throughout much of the game until the fourth quarter where they poured it on. With seconds remaining on the clock, Smith sunk a basket and was fouled on by the Lions. With time run off the clock, Smith walked up to the foul line "Like a man without a friend" and came up short for the tying point. In no way can any blame be placed on one person. Latrobe lost much, earlier in the game.

Nonetheless, there were many bright spots throughout the year for the Wildcats. They started off their regular season on the right foot as they upped their record to 3-0. Games







### Boys' Swimming

The 1977-78 Boys Swim Team wrapped up the Section V Championship by closing out the season with a letter perfect 6-0 record. In the opening section home meet, Latrobe whitewashed Greensburg Salem 114-56. John Lynch set a new 200 Individual Medley record with a time of 2:19.7 against Hempfield. The 'Cats winning streak rolled on as they easily won 120-52. During this meet three new records were smashed. 















### Wrestling




### **Boys' Tennis**

The filling out of application forms followed the choice of what colleges a student might like to attend. This in turn was followed by an agonizing wait for the acceptance letter.


















#### "Sophomores In"

When asked how she felt about retiring, Mrs. Gadd replied, "I enjoy being able to do what I want, at the time I want, without having to wait for a bell to








