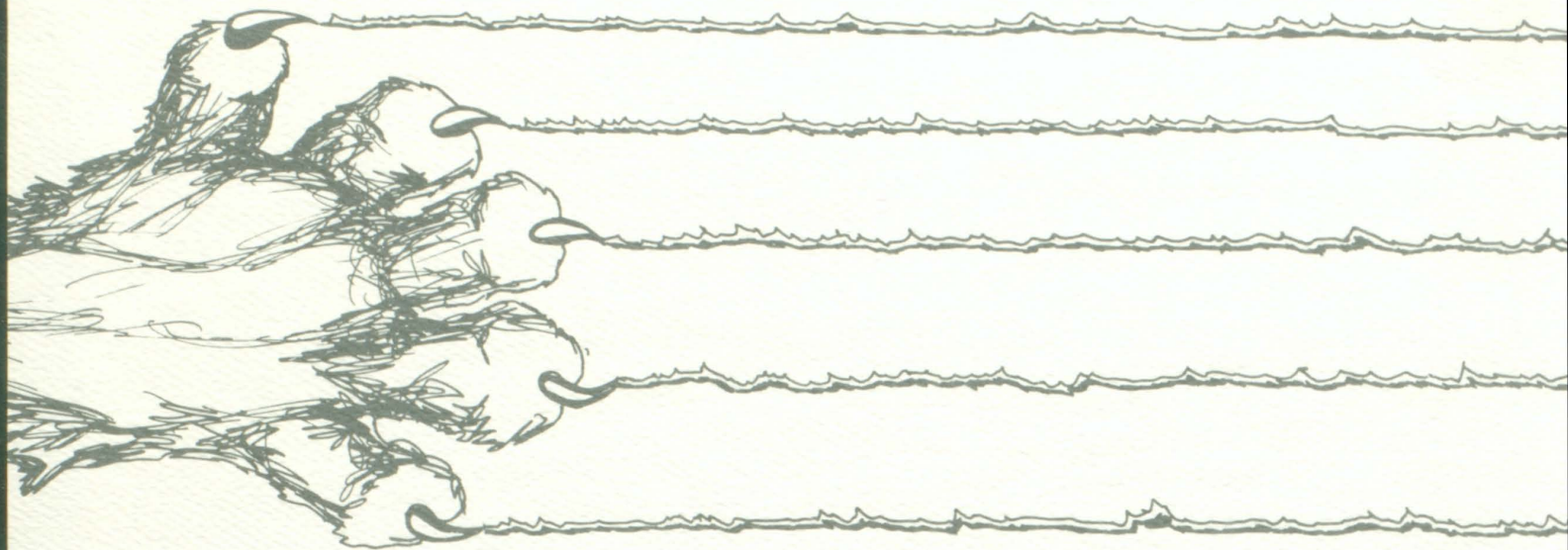






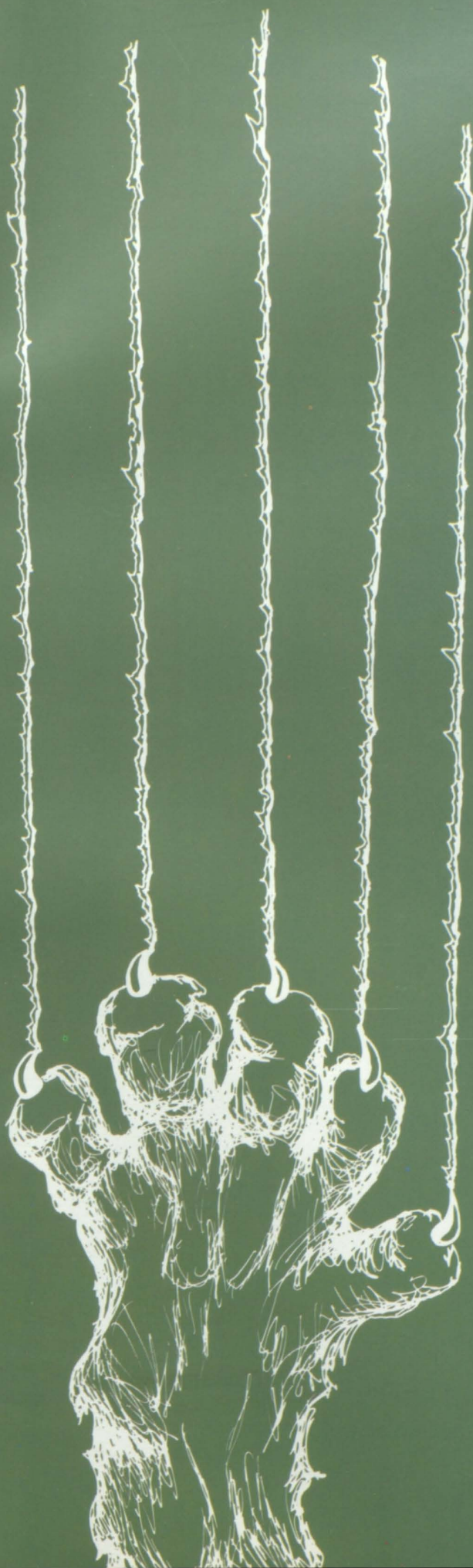

edge, concern for futures, or a combination of these, something drew us to Greater Latrobe Senior High School.

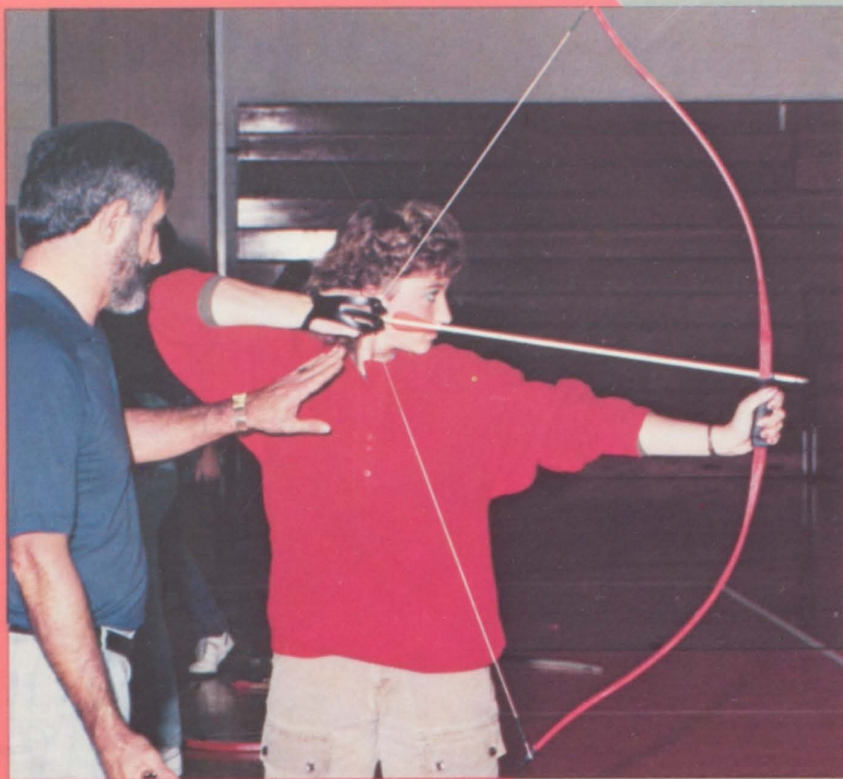
The year created different impressions in all of us, with the depth of each varying from person to person. We have left with different memories, but our time spent here will remain at least a scratch in the surfaces of our lives.

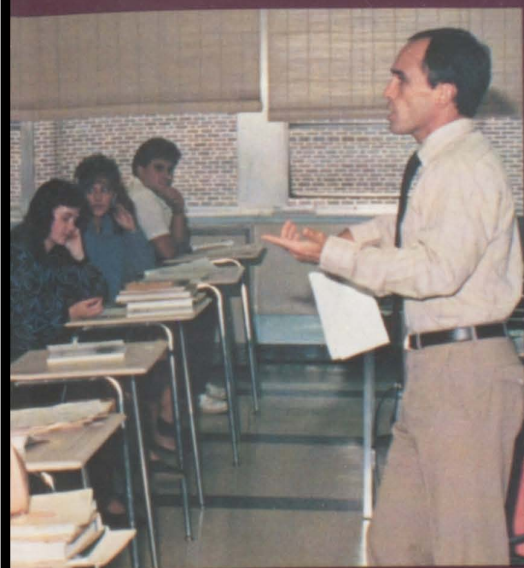

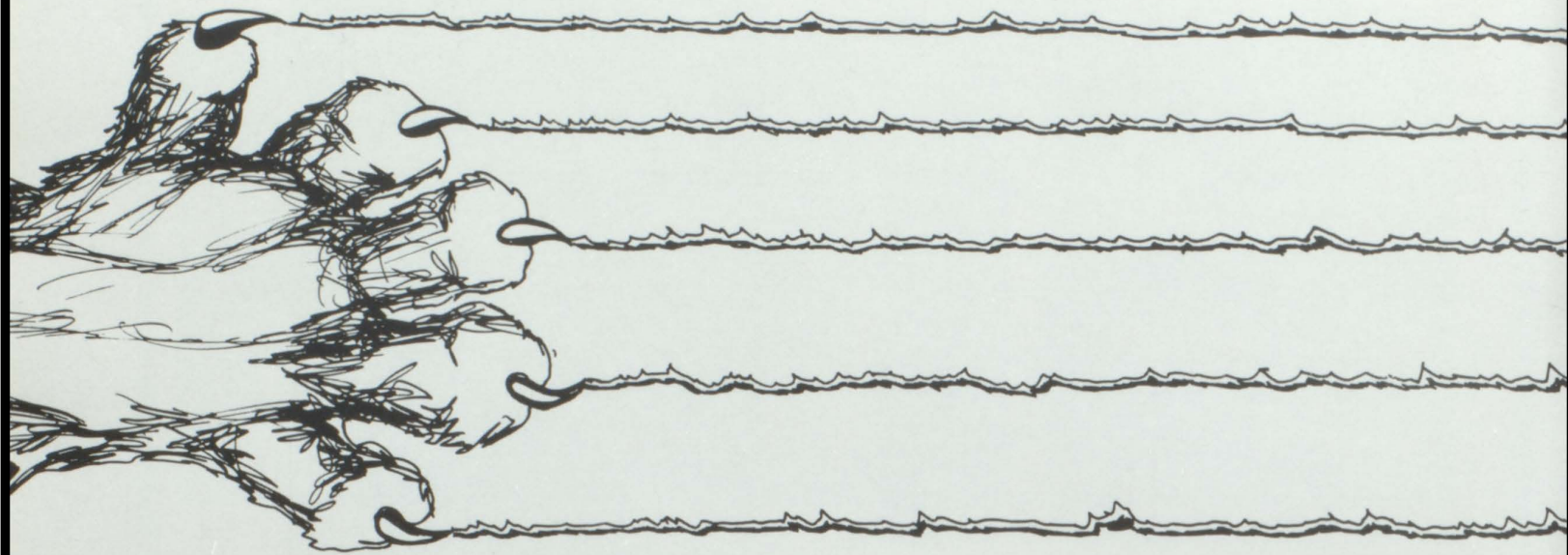

CATS KICK OFF NEW BALDONIERI SEASON

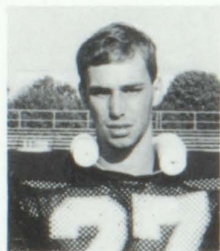

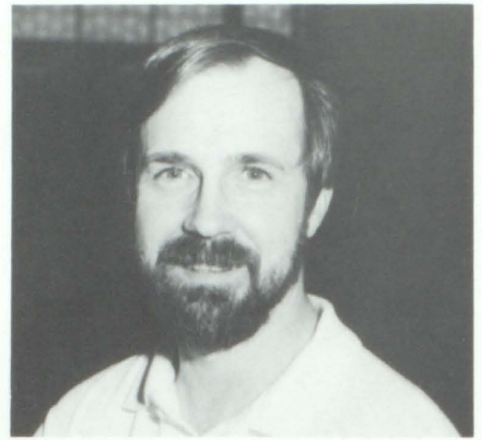
CATS FISH OUT THIRD

Colophon

The 1988 LATROBEAN, of Greater Latrobe High School, was printed in offset lithography by Heff Jones Yearbooks, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania 17325. The local representative is C.T. Miller and the customer service advisor was Jon Lundell. The press run for 1988 was 925 copies of 256 pages. Paper is 100# Bordeaux gloss except for pages 1 to 16 which used 100# IKONOLUX.

The cover was custom embossed on Leathertex Antique material with foil in lieu of applied color. It was mounted on 160 point binder's board at the Herff Jones Cover Plant in Montgomery, Alabama 36108. The book was smyth sewn in sixteen page signatures, trimmed to 9 X 12, rounded and backed with decorative head and foot bands.

The front endsheets were school designed on 65# Colortext paper stock. In addition to the high carbon jet-black ink used throughout, there are two flats of process four-color.

Type is Korinna with appropriate emphasis faces done in 10 point for captions and 12 point for body copy. Headlines appear in 18 point, 42 point, and 72 point Korinna Extra Bold and Freehand.
