












Tell me not, in mournful numbers, Life is but an empty dream! For the soul is dead that slumbers, And things are not what they seem.


Many students in the Class of '90 exceeded the limit of being just average in a variety of fields.




A LOOK BACK AT 1989

Revolution in Europe and Asia sparked a worldwide call for democracy. In Beijing, China, nearly one million protesters stormed Tienanmen Square, demanding an end to political and social corruption. The revolt climaxed on June 3 when Chinese troops opened fire and killed up to 3600 protesters. Following Chinese protests, East Germans called for the tearing down of the Berlin Wall that divided east from west since 1961. On November 9, thousands of East Germans entered the west to seek freedom. While Europeans celebrated their victory, Chinese upheld martial law over student protestors. Elsewhere, the death of Japanese Emperor Hirohito and Iranian leader Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini caused many changes throughout the world.

Nationally, the newly-elected administration of President George Bush strengthened relations with Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev who instituted liberal reforms in the U.S.S.R. Disaster, however, also plagued the nation. On September 22, Hurricane Hugo's 135 m.p.h. winds snapped power lines and trees of the flooded coastal city of Charleston, South Carolina. Nearly one month later, an earthquake measuring 7.0 on the Richtor Scale shook the Northern California area and shattered the lives of thousands that lost family and friends. Other unfortunate events included the U.S.S. lowa explosion, the Alaska Exxon Oil Spill, and the Sioux City, lowa plane crash.



On April 26, entertainment mourned the death of Lucille Ball, star of I Love Lucy, In baseball, a court ruling permanently banned Cincinnati Reds Manager Pete Rose for gambling on sporting events. Rose will still be eligible for Hall of Fame nomination in 1992.

The Winterguard is similar to the Marching Band's colorguard and consists of silks and rifles. The Winterguard rehearses in the gym and competes once a week.










Students who speak their minds

Colophon

Okay, you must be really bored if you are reading the Colophon. We must first include a plug for Herff Jones. The 1990 Latrobean, of Greater Latrobe High School, was printed in offset Lithography by Herff Jones Yearbooks, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania 17325. We collected the \$24 fee for this work of art and managed to sell a whop copies of pure reading pleasure. We next began to design our cover, endsheets, paper, ink, etc ... (all of the technical "stuff" which we knew nothing about when we began the book). Jon Lundell, our customer service advisor, came to our rescue and worked our ideas into the book's cover (special thanks to Jon and everyone for making the book so professional). The cover is made from Ultramarine Blue material with foil in lieu of applied color. Blind mbossing, a term more for seeing-eye dogs than yearbooks, was replaced by custom embossing. Signature 1 used 100 pound IKONOLUX (this doesn't mean each page weighs that much!), and 100 pound Bordeaux loss paper on the rest. There were action-packed photos, clever copy, and whatever it took to fill our 260 pages (actually 264 with the 4 blanks at the end, but who's counting?). We used Helvetica type for 8 and 10 point captions and 12 point copy. We also used Helvetica Medium and Brush type for 30, 48, and 72 point headlines. The endsheets, which is the clever term for the thick sheets on each end, were school designed on 65 pound White Stock in two colors. When we actually started the book, two people kept us from going insane: Mrs. Janet Henderson, our publications advisor, and C. T. (Cropping Tool) Miller, our local HJ representative. Thanks for everything! We sent the cover to the Herff Jones Cover Plant in Montgomery, Alabama 36108, where it was mounted on 160 point binder's board, smyth sewn in 16 page signatures, trimmed to 9 X 12, and rounded and backed with decorative head and footbands. We used jet black ink on everything and process four-color on the first 2 flats. Well, that's it. You finally see some of the action happening behind Latrobean's closed doors. To our fellow seniors, we'll never forget you and hope this book captured our final year at GLHS. This brings us to the end. We would once again like to thank the staff for TAKING THE CHALLENGE.
