Miles of Memories








Career and Technology Center

Capstone Science

Whether they were trekking through the woods of Greater Latrobe or venturing to the outskirts of Ligonier, the adventures of Capstone students this year never grew tiresome. Capstone, a unique science course offered at Greater Latrobe, was a special opportunity only available to seniors. The class included a smaller, closer group of students than the typical science class. Mrs. Wright stated, "The coolest thing about Capstone is that whatever the topic of the environment is, Capstone can focus on it." The class actually completed a conservation project that involved a grant, permit, and supplies and ultimately fixed an environmental problem. 










"Feel the Heat, Get the Fever"








Boys' Swimming and Diving

"To the Baseline..."





Wrestling


"Everybody Loves Everybody"


"Speed Kills"





"They're with the Team"






